AGGREGATE BALANCE-SHEET AT 30TH JUNE, 1913.

REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL, DATED SEPTEMBER, 1913, UNDER SECTION 20 OF THE COMMONWEALTH BANK ACT 1911.

1. The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Bank for the half-year ended the 30th June, 1913, both in the Commonwealth and in London, have been examined by officers and auditors acting under my direction and by myself.

2. The existence of the Assets set forth in the Aggregate Balance-sheet for the period under review, and as submitted by the Governor of the Bank, have been fully verified.

3. The Balance-sheet exhibits the Bank's affairs in accordance with the entries in the books of the Bank, and, in my opinion, it is correct, subject to the qualification which follows—

For the greater part, the Balance-sheet deals with actual cash transactions only. The liabilities do not include amounts outstanding, such as that due to the Postmaster-General for services rendered up to the end of the half-year. This sum amounted to £6,268 0s. 9d. The Governor of the Bank explains that as the Bank is still in its formation process, and the amount due to the Postmaster-General was not ascertainable at the time the Balance-sheet was made up, it was thought advisable to omit the item, but in future the Bank itself can determine the liability without waiting for the claim, in order to provide for the same in the Half-Yearly Balance-sheet, and include it in the Profit and Loss Account.

The Assets do not include amounts due to the Bank, such as rentals, which were temporarily held by the Treasury—these amounted to £882 8s. 4d.

The whole cost of furnishing and equipping the Bank offices has been charged out as current expenditure and debited to Profit and Loss Account, these charges, exclusive of stationery, amounting to over £13,200.

The three amounts mentioned, if included as Liabilities and Assets respectively, in open accounts, would have reduced the debit balance of Profit and Loss by over £7,800.

4. The Governor of the Bank and the officers at the Head Office and at the Agencies throughout rendered every assistance to the auditors, and gave all information and explanations which were required in connexion with the audit.
