AGGREGATE BALANCE-SHEET AT 30TH JUNE, 1914.

REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL, DATED 25TH AUGUST, 1914, UNDER SECTION 20 OF THE COMMONWEALTH BANK ACT 1911.

1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 20 of the *Commonwealth Bank Act*, 1911, the Governor of the Bank on the 17th instant, submitted the Balance-sheet of the Bank in the prescribed form, setting forth the position of the Bank's affairs as at the 30th June, 1914, and that it was duly certified to by me on the 21st instant.

2. The affairs of the Bank were subjected both in the Commonwealth and in London to complete inspection, and audit for the half-yearly period ended the 30th June last, with the result that a net profit of £8,093 8s. 5d. was earned by the Bank during the six months, in addition to £1,547 9s. 4d. shown as profit for the preceding six months, or £9,640 17s. 9d. for the whole financial year.

3. In the first half-year of 1913-14 the General Bank earned £17,708 12s. 5d., while the Savings Bank Department lost £16,161 3s. 1d. and in the second half-year the General Bank earned a profit of £18,980 19s., the Savings Bank losing £10,287 10s. 7d. For the two half-yearly periods the General Bank's transactions resulted in a profit of £36,089 11s. 5d., and the Savings Bank Department's transactions resulted in a loss of £26,148 13s. 8d.

4. For the two years during which the Bank has carried on operations the result has been that the General Bank shows a profit of £11,760 18s. 4d., and the Savings Bank Department a loss of £48,756 18s. 2d., or together a net loss of £36,995 14s. 10d.

5. During the past half-year the Bank credited to the Interest Account the sum of £1,642 13s. 9d., representing the period's portion of the redemption value of the profit on securities purchased at a discount. The amounts so credited were ascertained by actuarial calculation.

6. Every facility was rendered by the Governor of the Bank and his officers to the Audit Examiners throughout the Commonwealth, and to Sir Wm. Pender in London, in connexion with the recent inspection.
