CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND.

STATEMENT OF SURPLUSES AND DEFICIENCIES.

Note.—Until the end of 1906-7 the whole balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was paid to the States. In 1907-8 the whole of the balance was paid to the States after the provision of £443,621 had been made for expenditure in the following year under Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet) Accounts. From 1908-9, and until the abolition of the book-keeping provisions of the Constitution in 1910-11 the States received only three-fourths of the net Customs and Excise Revenue, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet) Accounts to provide for expenditure in subsequent years. Since 1910-11 the States have received twenty-five shillings per head of population per annum, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund has been transferred to Trust Fund, Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet), Invalid and Old-age Pensions and War Pensions Accounts. The surplus existing at 30th June, 1923, will be used for the payment of Invalid and Old-age Pensions and War Pensions.
