## CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND.

## STATEMENT OF SURPLUSES AND DEFICIENCIES.

Note.—Until the end of 1906-7 the whole balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was paid to the States. In 1907-8 the whole of the balance was paid to the States after the provision of £193,621 had been made for expenditure in subsequent years under Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions Account. From 1908-9, and until the abolition of the bookkeeping provisions of the Constitution in 1910-11 the States received only three-fourths of the net Customs and Excise Revenue, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet). Accounts to provide for expenditure in subsequent years. From 1910-11 until the end of 1926-27 the States received twenty-five shillings per head of population per annum, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and War Pensions Accounts. In 1927 Parliament passed the States Grants Act, which abolished the *per capita* payments as from 30th June, 1927, and provided lump sum grants for the year 1927-28, subject to terms of any agreement that might be entered into between the Commonwealth and all the States. An agreement has since been made between the Commonwealth and the States, which took effect from 1st July, 1927. Under this agreement the Commonwealth makes an annual payment of £7,584,912 towards interest on States' Debts and also makes annual sinking fund contributions at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each £100 of Net State Debts existing on 30th June, 1927, and 6s. for each £100 of New Debts created after that date. These provisions will operate for a temporary period of two years, and their continuance is dependent upon an amendment of the constitution which has yet to be obtained. Subject to this amendment the agreement also provides that the Commonwealth will take over the States' Debts existing on 1st July, 1929, and the States will pay all interest thereon over and above the annual sum of £7,584,912 to be provided by the Commonwealth.

The National Debt Skating Fund was established by the National Debt Skating Fund Act 1922-25, and came into operation on 11th August 1923. ## FINANCIAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN COMMONWEALTH AND STATES.

(Act No. 5 of 1928.)

On 12th December, 1927, representatives of the Commonwealth and State Governments signed a comprehensive agreement relating to finance, which has since been ratified by the Parliaments of the Commonwealth and the several States. The main features of this agreement are as follows:—

- (i) The Commonwealth to take over all debts of States existing on 1st July, 1929.
- (ii) From 1st July, 1927, the Commonwealth to apply £7,584,912 annually, for 58 years, from its revenues towards the payment of the interest charges on State debt; the States to contribute the balance of the interest payable.
- (iii) A sinking fund of 7s. 6d. per cent. to be established on the net debts of the States as existing at 30th June, 1927. To this sinking fund the Commonwealth to contribute 2s. 6d. per cent. and the States 5s. per cent. for 58 years.
- (iv) A sinking fund of 10s. per cent. to be established on all new borrowings after 1st July, 1927; the Commonwealth to contribute 6s. per cent. and the States to contribute 6s. per cent. for 63 years.
- (v) The management of Commonwealth and States' debts and the conduct of future borrowings for both Commonwealth and States to be in the hands of a newly-constituted Australian Loan Council, consisting of a representative of the Commonwealth and a representative of each State.
- (vi) A full settlement to be made in respect of "Transferred properties" whereby the Commonwealth will relieve the States of all liability in respect of £10,924,323 of debt, bearing interest at 5 per cent. (The Commonwealth has hitherto paid interest at the rate of 3½ per cent. on the value of the properties.)

*Amendment of Constitution.*—It is provided in the agreement that the Commonwealth shall seek an amendment of the Constitution, so that this agreement and any variation thereof, with the consent of all parties, shall have constitutional force and effect. Until the Constitution is so amended, the agreement will not come into full operation.

*Temporary Provisions.*—Pending the amendment of the Constitution being obtained, certain provisions operate during a period of two years from 1st July, 1927, to 30th June, 1929. These provisions include the following:—

- (i) The Commonwealth to pay to the States towards interest on State debts £7,584,912 per annum.
- (ii) The Commonwealth to pay interest of 5 per cent. on the agreed value of "transferred properties" viz., £10,924,323.
- (iii) Sinking Fund contributions to be payable by the Commonwealth and the States as from 1st July, 1927, except in the case of New South Wales, which State will commence its contributions on 1st July, 1928.

*Permanent Provisions.*—The permanent provisions of the agreement will not come into force unless, before the 1st July, 1929, the Constitution has been altered and the Commonwealth Parliament has passed a law validating the agreement. Subject to these conditions, the Commonwealth will take over the debts of the States existing on 1st July, 1929, and will assume, as between the Commonwealth and the States, the liabilities of the States to bond-holders. Thereafter, the States will pay to the Commonwealth all interest on the States' debts over and above the annual sum of £7,584,912 to be provided by the Commonwealth for 58 years from 1st July, 1927.

*Sinking Funds.*—Sinking Fund contributions are to be paid to the National Debt Commission constituted under the National Debt Sinking Fund Laws of the Commonwealth.

In the event of the proposed alteration of the Constitution not becoming law, and of the agreement not being validated thereunder on or before 30th June, 1929, the States will receive the benefit of all Sinking Fund contributions made during the temporary period.

Subject to the permanent provisions of the agreement coming into operation, the National Debt Commission will take over, on 1st July, 1929, the Public Debt Sinking Funds of the States, and will apply those funds to the redemption of the debts of the respective States.

Sinking Fund contributions under the agreement, in respect of the debts of a State, will not be accumulated, but will be applied to the redemption of the debt of that State. Where securities are purchased they will be cancelled, and thereafter the State concerned will pay to the Sinking Fund a further contribution at the rate of 4½ per cent. annum for a prescribed period. The Sinking Fund will thus receive the benefit of compound interest at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum.
