III. CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND.

TABLE No. 4.—ANNUAL RESULTS OF REVENUE TRANSACTIONS.

NOTE.—Until the end of 1906-7 the whole balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was paid to the States. In 1907-8 the whole of the balance was paid to the States after the provision of £193,621 had been made for expenditure in subsequent years under Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions Account. From 1908-9, and until the abolition of the bookkeeping provisions of the Constitution in 1910-11 the States received only three-fourths of the net Customs and Excise Revenue, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Trust Fund, Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet) Accounts to provide for expenditure in subsequent years. From 1910-11 until the end of 1926-27 the States received twenty-five shillings per head of population per annum. The States Grants Act 1927 abolished the per capita payments as from 30th June, 1927, and provided lump sum grants for the year 1927-28, subject to the terms of any agreement made between the Commonwealth and all the States.

A "Financial Agreement" since made between the Commonwealth and the States, and validated by the Commonwealth Parliament under an amendment of the Constitution, provides, *inter alia*, for (a) an annual payment by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, of £7,594,912 towards interest on State Debts, (b) annual sinking fund contributions by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each £100 of Net State Debts existing on 30th June, 1927, and 5s. for each £100 of New Debts created after that date, (c) the Commonwealth to take over State Debts existing on 1st July, 1929, and the States to provide all interest thereon in excess of the annual sum of £7,594,912 provided by the Commonwealth.

Since 1910-11 the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund has been appropriated for payment of Invalid and Old-age Pensions, War Pensions and other services for which Parliamentary appropriations were available, including reduction of the accumulated deficit.

The National Debt Sinking Fund was established by the *National Debt Sinking Fund Act 1923-24*, and amounts standing on 11th August, 1923, by that Act the Loan Sinking Fund, Northern Territory Sinking Fund and Port Augusta Railway Sinking Fund were merged into the National Debt Sinking Fund. All moneys standing to the credit of these funds were transferred to, and all investments of these funds bearing investments of the National Debt Sinking Fund.

1. For a period of 30 years commencing on 1st July, 1923, and up to 30th June, 1936, the National Debt Sinking Fund Act the Treasurer is required to pay into the Fund each year in accordance with that Act and other Acts the following moneys:—
(a) 6 per cent. of the debt redeemed out of the National Debt Sinking Fund, to 30th June, 1936, except upon debt related to expenditure of Postmaster-General's Department; (b) 10s. per cent. of the unconvertible debt, excepting debt relating to Postmaster-General's expenditure, created in each financial year and in any financial year prior thereto after the 30th June, 1923; (c) 6 per cent. of the debt redeemed out of the National Debt Sinking Fund, to 30th June, 1936, and cancelled, provided the redemptions are not made from moneys received as shown under 4 (e);
2. For a period of 30 years commencing in 1923-24—(a) 30s. per cent. on debt raised to the expenditure of the Postmaster-General's Department out of the Loan Fund up to 30th June, 1923; (b) 30s. per cent. of the expenditure of the Postmaster-General's Department from 1st July, 1923, to 30th June, 1934, provided that the contribution in respect of the expenditure in any one year shall not continue for more than 12 months; (c) 6 per cent. of the total receipts of the Fund on and after 1st July, 1935, and up to 30th June next preceding that financial year in which payment is being made, excluding from such receipts amounts paid into the Fund in accordance with 4 (e) and (f) hereunder;
3. 6 per cent. of the net profits of the Commonwealth Bank, and of the Commonwealth Savings Bank;
4. (a) Repayments of purchase money or advances under Section 50 of the *Vic. States Finance Act*. (b) Any unexpended balances of the Loan Fund. (c) Repayments of the *Vic. States Finance Act*. (d) Repayments of moneys received under the *Trustees of Loans with Germany Act*. (e) Contributions by States under the *Trustees Act 1927-28*.
5. In addition the Treasurer may, under Section 50, pay into the National Debt Sinking Fund out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund such further amount as he may determine.

In the years 1925-26 and 1926-27 contributions at the rate of 10s. per cent. per annum were paid into the National Debt Sinking Fund by the various States, in respect of loans raised by the Commonwealth for the States.

As from the 1st July, 1927, contributions have been paid into the Sinking Fund under the provisions of the Financial Agreement Validation Act No. 4 of 1929.
Under the provisions of this Act the following contributions are to be paid into the Fund during each year—
1. For an amount of £5,000,000 in each year commencing 1st July, 1927, on the net debt of each State existing at 30th June, 1927—
(a) 5s. per cent. by each State from revenues, provided that the 63 year period as regards New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1929.
(b) 5s. 6d. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue.
2. For a period of 63 years on each loan raised after 1st July, 1927, provided the loan is not raised for redemption or conversion purposes, or to provide for funding a deficit for a State—
(a) 5s. per cent. by each State from revenues, provided that the 63 year period as regards New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1929.
(b) 5s. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenues, in respect of the loans raised for each State.
Where it is agreed that a loan raised after 30th June, 1927, commences on a date other than that stated above, the rate of contribution shall be ascertained in accordance with the provisions of this Act, allowing that the contributions shall be deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4 1/2 per cent. per annum, compounded.
3. In respect of any loan raised at a margin up to 1927, to meet a revenue deficit occurring after that date, at least 4 per cent. per annum by the State concerned from revenues, for a period sufficient to provide for the redemption of that loan, allowing that the contributions shall be deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4 1/2 per cent. per annum, compounded.
4. Contribution of 4 1/2 per cent. by each State on cancelled debt for the balance of the period during which the 6s. per cent. contribution is payable in respect of that debt.
In addition contributions at the rate of 2s. per cent. per annum, for a period of ten years, are paid into the Fund by the Commonwealth from revenues under the Federal Aid Roads Act No. 40 of 1923.
