NOTE.—Until the end of 1906-7 the whole balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was paid to the States. In 1907-8 the whole of the balance was paid to the States after the provision of £193,621 had been made for expenditure in subsequent years under Invalid and Old-age Pensions Trust Account. From 1908-9, and until the abolition of the bookkeeping provisions of the Constitution in 1910-11 the States received only three-fourths of the net Customs and Excise Revenue, and the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was transferred to Invalid and Old-age Pensions, and Naval Defence (Construction of Fleet) Trust Accounts to provide for expenditure in subsequent years. From 1910-11 until the end of 1926-27 the States received twenty-five shillings per head of population per annum. The States Grants Act 1927 abolished the *per capita* payments as from 30th June, 1927, and provided lump sum grants for the year 1927-28, subject to the terms of any agreement made between the Commonwealth and all the States.

A "Financial Agreement" since made between the Commonwealth and the States, and validated by the Commonwealth Parliament under an amendment of the Constitution, provides, *inter alia*, for (a) an annual payment by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, of £7,584,912 towards interest on State Debts, (b) annual sinking fund contributions by the Commonwealth from 1st July, 1927, at the rate of 2s. 6d. for each £100 of Net State Debts existing on 30th June, 1927, and 5s. for each £100 of New Debts created after that date, (c) the Commonwealth to take over State Debts existing on 1st July, 1929, and the States to provide all interest thereon in excess of the annual sum of £7,584,912 provided by the Commonwealth.

From 1910-11 to 1939-40 the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was appropriated for payment of Invalid and Old-age Pensions, War Pensions and other services for which Parliamentary appropriations were available, including reduction of the accumulated deficit.

The Consolidated Revenue Fund for the financial years 1940-41 to 1946-47 was balanced, as all available revenue after charging ordinary services was used for war purposes.

In 1947-48 the balance of the Consolidated Revenue Fund was appropriated for payment of War Pensions, and in 1948-49, 1949-50 and 1950-51 the Consolidated Revenue Fund was balanced.

In 1951-52 the Consolidated Revenue Fund was balanced by the appropriation within the year of the surplus of £98,500,000 to the National Debt Sinking Fund for investment in a special loan for State works requirements.

NOTE.—Penny postage was introduced into Victoria on 1st April, 1901, and was extended to the whole Commonwealth and the British Dominions on 1st May, 1911. On 28th October, 1918, a War Postage Tax of ½d. was imposed, but the revenue from this source was not credited to Post Office Revenue. On 2nd October, 1920, the War Postage Tax was discontinued and the ordinary postage increased to 2d. On 1st October, 1923, the ordinary postage was reduced to 1½d. and it was restored to 2d. on 4th August, 1930. From 10th December, 1941, a War Postage Tax of ½d. was imposed, but from 1st July, 1949, that charge became part of the rate of 2½d. On 1st December, 1950, the ordinary postage rate was increased to 3d., and on 9th July, 1951, the rate was increased to 3½d.

In the years 1925-26 and 1926-27 contributions at the rate of 10s. per cent. per annum were paid into the National Debt Sinking Fund by the various States in respect of loans raised by the Commonwealth from the 1st January 1925 to the 31st December 1927. Contributions have been paid into the Sinking Fund under the provisions of the Financial Agreements Validation Act No. 4 of 1929 and the Financial Agreement Act No. 46 of 1944. Under the provisions of these Acts the following contributions are to be made by the States from revenue, provided that the 65-year period as regards New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1928.

- (1) 2s. 6d. per cent. for a period of 60 years on each loan raised after 1st July, 1927, provided that the loan is not raised for redemption or conversion purposes, or to provide for funding a deficit for a State—
- (2) 4s. per cent. for each State from revenue provided that the 65-year period as regards New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1928.
- (3) 4s. per cent. for each State from revenue provided that the 65-year period as regards New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1928.
- (4) In respect of any loan raised on behalf of a State to meet a revenue deficit, other than those loans referred to in Clause 3 above, at least 4 per cent. per annum by the State concerned from revenue for a period sufficient to provide for the redemption of that loan, allowing that the contributions shall be deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum.
- (5) Contributions of 4s. per cent. by each State on uncancelled bills for the balance of the period during which the original contribution is payable in respect of that debt.

In addition contributions at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum, for each State, for each loan raised after 1st January, 1927, to 30th December, 1948, under the Federal Aid Roads and Works Act No. 3 of 1927. Acts Nos. 16 of 1924, 25 of 1931 and 65 of 1939 and at the rate of £2 10s. per cent. per annum from 1st January, 1927, to 30th December, 1948, under the Federal Aid Roads and Works Act No. 3 of 1927.

STATEMENT OF TRANSACTIONS.

1. INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND.

Under Article III., Section 3 of the Fund Agreement the subscription of each member is equal to its quota and must be paid in full to the Fund at the appropriate depository. The quota of Australia has been fixed at \$200,000,000.

Under Article III., Section 3 (b) of the Fund Agreement each Member is required to pay in gold, as a minimum, the smaller of—

- (i) twenty-five per cent. of its quota; or
- (ii) ten per cent. of its net official holdings of gold and United States dollars as at the date when the Fund notifies members that it will shortly be in a position to begin exchange transactions. This was 12th September, 1946.

The Fund determined for the purposes of Article III., Section 3 (b) that the net official holdings of gold and United States dollars of Australia as at 12th September, 1946, were:—Gold, 2,107,338 fine ounces; United States dollars, 10,291,602. On the basis of these amounts the gold subscription payable by Australia was \$8,404,843.20 or 240,138.377 fine ounces.

Each member is required to pay the balance of its quota in its own currency. Under Article III., Section 5 of the Fund Agreement, however, the Fund may accept non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities in place of part of the currency subscription of a member.

A total of £88,143,066 has been paid to meet Australia's subscription. This includes an increase in the Australian currency subscription made necessary by the alteration in the Australian-United States dollar exchange rate on 19th September, 1949. The obligation was met as follows:—

A total of \$20,000,000 was purchased from the Fund on 24th October, 1949, in exchange for Australian currency as provided by Article V. of the Agreement. The cost, viz. £8,928,571 8s. 7d. was met by the Commonwealth Bank and the dollars were sold by the Bank to finance Australian transactions in accordance with normal banking procedure. The service charge of \$150,000 was met by the Bank.

A further \$30,000,000 was purchased from the Fund in exchange for Australian currency on 20th August, 1952. The service charge of \$150,000 was met by the Bank.

2. INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT.

As a condition of membership Australia undertook to subscribe for 2,000 shares of the capital stock of the Bank at a par value of \$100,000 per share.

Under Article II., Section 5 of the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank, the subscription of each member is divided into two parts as follows:—

- (i) 20 per cent. to be paid or subject to call as needed by the Bank for its operations;
- (ii) the remaining 80 per cent. to be subject to call by the Bank only when required to meet certain obligations of the Bank as specified in the Agreement.

Under Article II., Section 7 of the Agreement payment of the amount due under (i) in the preceding paragraph is to be made in gold or United States dollars and in the currencies of members as follows:—

- (i) 2 per cent. of the subscription in gold or United States dollars;
- (ii) when calls are made the remaining 18 per cent. shall be paid in the currency of the member.

Under Article V., Section 12 of the Agreement the Bank may accept in substitution for part of the currency subscription payable by a member non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities.

On 22nd August, 1950, an agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$100,000,000 for a term of 25 years. Interest at $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly, on 1st March and 1st September each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. This interest charge includes 1 per cent. commission required by the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for the purpose of building up the reserves of the Bank. A commitment charge of $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. Drawings to 30th June, 1952, amounted to \$64,707,067.

On 8th July, 1952, a further agreement was signed with the International Bank for a loan of \$50,000,000 for a term of twenty years. Interest at $\frac{4}{3}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly, on 1st June and 1st December each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. This interest charge includes 1 per cent. commission required by the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for the purpose of building up the reserves of the Bank. A commitment charge of $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time.
