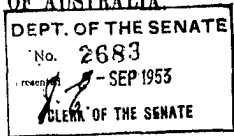

NOTE.—Penny postage was introduced into Victoria on 1st April, 1901, and was extended to the whole Commonwealth and the British Dominions on 1st May, 1911. On 28th October, 1918, a War Postage Tax of 4d. was imposed, but the revenue from this source was not credited to Post Office Revenue. On 2nd October, 1920, the War Postage Tax was discontinued and the ordinary postage increased to 2d. On 1st October, 1923, the ordinary postage was reduced to 1½d. and it was restored to 2d. on 4th August, 1930. On 10th December, 1941, a War Postage Tax of ½d. was imposed, but from 1st July, 1949, that charge became part of the rate of 2½d. On 1st December, 1950, the ordinary postage rate was increased to 3d., and on 9th July, 1951, the rate was increased to 3½d.

NATIONAL DEBT SINKING FUND.

Table No. 58.—SUMMARY OF TRANSACTIONS IN RESPECT OF COMMONWEALTH DEBTS FROM THE INCEPTION OF FUND TO 30th JUNE, 1953.

The National Debt Sinking Fund was established by the National Debt Sinking Fund Act 1929-30, and came into operation on 11th August, 1929. By that Act the Loan Sinking Fund, Northern Territory Sinking Fund, and the National Debt Sinking Fund were merged into the National Debt Sinking Fund. All moneys standing to the credit of these funds were transferred to, and all investments of these funds became investments of the National Debt Sinking Fund.

The Treasury is required to pay into the Fund each year in accordance with the provisions of the National Debt Sinking Fund Act and other Acts money, as set out hereunder. Payment may in accordance with sub-paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 be made from revenue subject to a reduction equal to the total of all other amounts paid to the fund comprising those returned to under 5 (a), (b), (c), (d) and (6) hereunder.

1. For a period of 30 years commencing on 1st July, 1929, to 30th June, 1959, 30s. per cent. on debt related to the expenditure of the Postmaster-General's Department out of the Loan Fund up to 30th June, 1929. (b) 20s. per cent. on a sum equal to the total of the interest on the National Debt Sinking Fund for the 30 years.

2. (a) 5 per cent. of the debt redeemed out of the National Debt Sinking Fund, to 30th June, 1930, and cancelled, provided the redemptions are not made from moneys received as shown under 4 (a), and (b) hereunder for the period 1st July, 1930, to 30th June, 1952, and up to 30th June next preceding that financial year in which payment is being made, excluding from such receipts amounts paid into the Fund in accordance with 4 (a), (b), (c), (d) and (6) hereunder. Provided that the payments under (a) and (b) of this sub-paragraph, insofar as they relate to the Postmaster-General's Department, are not to exceed the total of the interest on the National Debt Sinking Fund for the 30 years.

3. (a) Repayment of loans or advances made out of Loan Fund. (b) Repayments of purchase money or advances under Section 39 of the War Service Loans Act. (c) Moneys credited in respect of Loans from the Loan Fund to the National Debt Sinking Fund under Section 40 of the War Service Loans Act. (d) Moneys credited in accordance with Section 41 of the National Debt Sinking Fund (Special Provisions) Act No. 53 of 1931.

In the years 1925-26 and 1926-27 contributions at the rate of 10s. per cent. per annum from revenue were paid into the National Debt Sinking Fund by the various States in respect of loans raised by the Commonwealth for the States.

5. Contributions of 4 1/2 per cent. by each State on arrears due for the balance of the period during which the original contribution is payable in respect of that debt.

6. Contributions of 4 1/2 per cent. by each State on arrears due for a period of seven years from 1st July, 1929, have been paid into the Fund by the Commonwealth from revenue under the Federal Aid Roads Act No. 49 of 1929, 29 of 1931 and 63 of 1930 and at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent. per annum from 1st January, 1931, to 31st December, 1948, under the Federal Aid Roads and Works Act No. 3 of 1937.

STATEMENT OF TRANSACTIONS.

1. INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND.

Under Article III., Section 3 of the Fund Agreement the subscription of each member is equal to its quota and must be paid in full to the Fund at the appropriate depository. The quota of Australia has been fixed at \$200,000,000.

Under Article III., Section 3 (b) of the Fund Agreement each Member is required to pay in gold, as a minimum, the smaller of—

- (i) twenty-five per cent. of its quota; or
- (ii) ten per cent. of its net official holdings of gold and United States dollars, as at the date when the Fund notifies members that it will shortly be in a position to begin exchange transactions. This was 12th September, 1946.

The Fund determined for the purposes of Article III., Section 3 (b) that the net official holdings of gold and United States dollars of Australia as at 12th September, 1946, were:—Gold, 2,107,338 fine ounces; United States dollars, 10,291,692. On the basis of these amounts the gold subscription payable by Australia was \$3,101,843.20 or 240,138,377 fine ounces.

Each member is required to pay the balance of its quota in its own currency. Under Article III., Section 5 of the Fund Agreement, however, the Fund may accept non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities in place of part of the currency subscription of a member.

A total of £88,143,066 has been paid to meet Australia's subscription. This includes an increase in the Australian currency subscription made necessary by the alteration in the Australian-United States dollar exchange rate on 19th September, 1949. The obligation was met as follows:—

A total of \$30,000,000 was purchased from the Fund on 24th October, 1949, in exchange for Australian currency as provided by Article V. of the Agreement. The cost, viz. £8,928,571 8s. 7d. was met by the Commonwealth Bank and the dollars were sold by the Bank to finance Australian transactions in accordance with normal banking procedure. The service charge of \$150,000 was met by the Bank.

A further \$30,000,000 was purchased from the Fund in exchange for Australian currency on 20th August, 1952. The service charge of \$150,000 was met by the Bank.

2. INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT.

As a condition of membership Australia undertook to subscribe for 2,000 shares of the capital stock of the Bank at a par value of \$100,000 per share.

Under Article II., Section 5 of the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank, the subscription of each member is divided into two parts as follows:—

- (i) 20 per cent. to be paid or subject to call as needed by the Bank for its operations;
- (ii) the remaining 80 per cent. to be subject to call by the Bank only when required to meet certain obligations of the Bank as specified in the Agreement.

Under Article II., Section 7 of the Agreement payment of the amount due under (i) in the preceding paragraph is to be made in gold or United States dollars and in the currencies of members as follows:—

- (i) 2 per cent. of the subscription in gold or United States dollars;
- (ii) when calls are made the remaining 18 per cent. shall be paid in the currency of the member.

Under Article V., Section 12 of the Agreement the Bank may accept in substitution for part of the currency subscription payable by a member non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities.

On 22nd August, 1950, an agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$100,000,000 for a term of 25 years. Interest at $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly, on 1st March and 1st September each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. This interest charge includes 1 per cent. commission required by the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for the purpose of building up the reserves of the Bank. A commitment charge of $\frac{3}{8}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. Drawings to 30th June, 1953, amounted to \$91,296,519.

On 8th July, 1952, a further agreement was signed with the International Bank for a loan of \$50,000,000 for a term of twenty years. Interest at $\frac{4}{8}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly, on 1st June and 1st December each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. This interest charge includes 1 per cent. commission required by the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for the purpose of building up the reserves of the Bank. A commitment charge of $\frac{3}{8}$ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. Drawings to 30th June, 1953, amounted to \$11,225,596.
