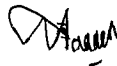

By that Act, the Loan Sinking Fund, the Northern Territory Sinking Fund and the Port Augusta Sinking Fund were merged into the National Debt Sinking Fund. All moneys standing to the credit of these funds were transferred to, and all investments of these funds became investments of, the National Debt Sinking Fund.

Table No. 41.—SUMMARY of Transactions in respect of STATES' DEBTS from the inception of the Fund to 30th JUNE, 1957.

In the years 1925-26 and 1926-27 contributions at the rate of 10s. per cent. were paid into the National Debt Sinking Fund by the various States in respect of loans raised by the Commonwealth for the States. As from the 1st July, 1927, contributions have been paid into the Sinking Fund under the provisions of the Financial Agreement 1927 as amended.

Under the provisions of the Financial Agreement, the following contributions are to be paid into the Fund during each year—

1. For a period of 58 years commencing 1st July, 1927, on the date that each State commences its 58-year period for New South Wales shall commence on 1st July, 1928.
2. For a period of 53 years on each loan raised after 1st July, 1927, provided that the loan is not raised for redemption or conversion purposes, or to provide for funding a deficit for a State—
(a) 5s. per cent. by each State commencing on 1st July, 1928.
- (b) 2s. 6d. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue.
- (c) Where it is agreed that a loan raised after 30th June, 1927, extended on wasting assets, should be redeemed in a shorter period than 53 years, the annual contribution payable by the State shall be increased to such an amount as will redeem the debt in the shorter period.
- (d) Where it is agreed that a loan raised after 30th June, 1927, should be redeemed in a shorter period than 53 years, the annual contribution payable by the Commonwealth shall commence on 1st July, 1928.
3. In respect of any loan raised after 30th June, 1927, for the redemption of a State loan, the contribution payable by the Commonwealth shall be 15s. per cent. per annum from revenue by the Commonwealth and at 5s. per cent. per annum from revenue by the State for the period commencing on the 1st July next succeeding the date on which the loan is raised until 30th June, 1944; thereafter for a period of 39 years, commencing on 1st July, 1944, at 4s. per cent. per annum by the Commonwealth and 15s. per cent. per annum by the State concerned.
4. In respect of any loan raised after 30th June, 1927, for the redemption of a Commonwealth loan, the contribution payable by the Commonwealth shall be 15s. per cent. per annum from revenue by the Commonwealth and at 4 per cent. per annum by the State concerned.
5. 4½ per cent. by each State on cancelled debt for the redemption of that loan, the contributions being deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum by the State concerned.

In addition contributions at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum for a period of eleven years from 1st July, 1926, were paid into the Fund by the Commonwealth from revenue under the Federal Aid Roads Acts Nos. 46 of 1926, 22 of 1931 and 62 of 1936 and at the rate of £2 10s. per cent. per annum from 1st January, 1937, to 31st December, 1946, under the Federal Aid Roads and Works Act No. 3 of 1937.

Note.—Penny postage was introduced into Victoria on 1st April, 1901, and was extended to the whole Commonwealth and the British Dominions on 1st May, 1911. On 28th October, 1918, a War Postage Tax of 4d. was imposed, but the revenue from this source was not credited to Post Office Revenue. On 2nd October, 1920, the War Postage Tax was discontinued and the ordinary postage increased to 2d. On 1st October, 1923, the ordinary postage was reduced to 1½d. and it was restored to 2d. on 4th August, 1930. From 10th December, 1941, a War Postage Tax of 3d. was imposed, but from 1st July, 1949, that charge became part of the rate of 2½d. On 1st December, 1950, the ordinary postage rate was increased to 3d., and on 9th July, 1951, the rate was increased to 3½d. The current rate, operative since 1st October, 1956, is 4d.

STATEMENT OF TRANSACTIONS.

1. INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND.

Under Article III., Section 3 (a) of the Fund Agreement the subscription of each member is equal to its quota and must be paid in full to the Fund at the appropriate depository. The quota of Australia has been fixed at \$200,000,000.

Under Article III., Section 3 (b) of the Fund Agreement each member is required to pay in gold, as a minimum, the smaller of—

- (i) twenty-five per cent. of its quota; or
- (ii) ten per cent. of its net official holdings of gold and United States dollars as at the date when the Fund notifies members that it will shortly be in a position to begin exchange transactions. This was 12th September, 1946.

The Fund determined for the purposes of Article III., Section 3 (b) (ii) that the net official holdings of gold and United States dollars of Australia as at 12th September, 1946, were:—Gold, 2,107,338 fine ounces; United States dollars, 10,291,602. On the basis of these amounts the gold subscription payable by Australia was \$8,404,843.20 or 240,138.377 fine ounces.

Each member is required to pay the balance of its quota in its own currency. Under Article III., Section 5 of the Fund Agreement, however, the Fund may accept non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities in place of part of the currency subscription of a member not needed for the Fund's operations.

A total of £88,143,066 has been paid to meet Australia's subscription. This includes an increase in the Australian currency subscription made necessary by the alteration in the Australian-United States dollar exchange rate on 19th September, 1949. The obligation was met as follows:—

Under Article V., Section 3 of the Fund Agreement, Australia purchased \$20,000,000 from the Fund with Australian currency on 24th October, 1949, and \$30,000,000 on 20th August, 1952. Under Article V., Section 7 of the Fund Agreement Australia repaid these dollar drawings by repurchasing Australian currency from the Fund to the value of \$24,000,000 during 1953-54 and \$26,000,000 during 1954-55. These transactions were carried out by the Commonwealth Bank. They did not involve the Commonwealth Public Account.

2. INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT.

As a condition of membership Australia undertook to subscribe for 2,000 shares of the capital stock of the Bank at a par value of \$100,000 per share.

Under Article II., Section 5 of the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank, the subscription of each member is divided into two parts as follows:—

- (i) 20 per cent. to be paid or subject to call as needed by the Bank for its operations;
- (ii) the remaining 80 per cent. to be subject to call by the Bank only when required to meet certain obligations of the Bank as specified in the Agreement.

Under Article II., Section 7 of the Agreement payment of the amount due under (i) in the preceding paragraph is to be made in gold or United States dollars and in the currencies of members as follows:—

- (i) 2 per cent. of the subscription in gold or United States dollars;
- (ii) when calls are made the remaining 18 per cent. shall be paid in the currency of the member.

Under Article V., Section 12 of the Agreement the Bank may accept in substitution for part of the currency subscription payable by a member non-negotiable, non-interest bearing securities.

In January, 1957 the security listed in (iii) above was reduced in value to £10,054,550 following the release of £1 million, in accordance with the Bank's Articles of Agreement, for use in its loan operations. This sum was met from the Consolidated Revenue Fund as is provided for in the *International Monetary Agreement Act 1947*.

On 22nd August, 1950, an agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$100,000,000 for a term of 25 years. Interest at 4½ per cent. is payable half-yearly, on 1st March and 1st September each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. This interest charge includes 1 per cent. commission required by the Articles of Agreement of the International Bank for the purpose of building up the reserves of the Bank. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. was paid half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. The loan was fully drawn by the closing date, 31st December, 1953.

On 8th July, 1952, a second agreement was signed with the International Bank for a loan of \$30,000,000 for a term of twenty years. Interest of 4½ per cent., including 1 per cent. commission, is payable half-yearly, on 1st June and 1st December each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. was paid half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. The loan was fully drawn by the closing date, 30th September, 1954.

On 2nd March, 1954, a third agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$54,000,000 for a term of fifteen years. Interest of 4½ per cent., including 1 per cent. commission, is payable half-yearly, on 1st March and 1st September each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. was paid half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. The loan was fully drawn by the closing date, 30th September, 1955.

On 18th March, 1955, a fourth agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$54,500,000 for a term of fifteen years. Interest of 4½ per cent., including 1 per cent. commission, is payable half-yearly, on 15th March and 15th September each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. The loan was fully drawn by 31st December, 1956.

On 15th November, 1956, a fifth agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$9,230,000 for a term of ten years. Interest of 4½ per cent., including 1 per cent. commission, is payable half-yearly, on 1st June and 1st December each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. Drawings to 30th June, 1957, amounted to \$920,624.

On 3rd December, 1956, a sixth agreement was signed with the Bank for a loan of \$50,000,000 for a term of fifteen years. Interest of 4½ per cent., including 1 per cent. commission, is payable half-yearly, on 15th January and 15th July each year, on the amount of the loan withdrawn and outstanding from time to time. A commitment charge of ½ per cent. is payable half-yearly on the amount of the loan standing undrawn from time to time. Drawings to 30th June, 1957, amounted to \$468,824.
