In 1958-59 all members of the Fund were invited to increase their quotas by 50 per cent. and Australia consented to an increase of United States \$100,000,000 in its quota in June, 1959. The increase in Australia's subscription is equal to the increase in its quota and is payable as follows:—

On 29th June, 1959, a payment of £11,227,890 was made from the Consolidated Revenue Fund in respect of the gold portion of Australia's increased subscription. The increased subscription in Australian currency will be met by lodgment of a non-negotiable non-interest bearing security.

Transactions.

Australia purchased United States \$20,000,000 from the Fund with Australian currency in 1949 and United States \$30,000,000 in 1952. Australia repaid these drawings by repurchasing Australian currency from the Fund in 1953-54 and 1954-55.

On 30th April, 1959, Australia incurred an obligation under Article V, Section 7 (b) of the Fund Agreement to repurchase, with gold and convertible currencies, an amount of its original subscription in Australian currency to the Fund equivalent to United States \$14,081,000. This obligation was discharged on 17th June, 1959, by the payment from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of £6,323,910.

2. INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT.

Subscriptions.

Australia joined the Bank in 1947 and was allotted a capital subscription of United States \$200,000,000. Only 20 per cent. of members' subscriptions were called up, the remaining 80 per cent. being subject to call when required to meet obligations by the Bank arising out of its borrowing activities. Australia paid its 20 per cent. subscription as follows:—
