IV. GOVERNMENT SECURITIES ON ISSUE.

Note.—Public Securities on Issue, as set out in Tables Nos. 11 and 12, may not be aggregated without adjustment to indicate what is sometimes described as "public debt" or "net public debt".

For example, these tables do not include "public" securities or other forms of indebtedness redeemable by semi-governmental or local authorities, or the debt of other bodies guaranteed by governments. Again, there are forms of debt not evidenced by the issue of securities.

Some of the securities included in these tables are held by the Governments themselves. For example, a State Government may hold temporarily—or even for long periods—securities issued by the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth itself, through such institutions as the National Debt Commission, or through the Trust Funds, holds large investment in securities issued either directly by itself or on behalf of the States. A simple example is a security issued to an overseas lender directly by the Commonwealth, the proceeds of which are re-lent to the States in exchange for a domestic security. From the point of view of the aggregate net debt of the Commonwealth and the States, it would thus involve duplication if the sum of the securities on issue were regarded as representing the "net public debt".

Thus "securities on issue" is a clear-cut legal and financial concept which can be stated with precision. "Net public debt" is a concept which admits of many interpretations, and the following tables do not purport to record it. Analyses of changes in the over-all indebtedness of public authorities are given in the White Paper on National Income.

In the years 1925-26 and 1926-27, contributions at the rate of 10s. per annum were paid into the National Debt Sinking Fund by the various States in respect of loans raised by the Commonwealth for the States. From the 1st July, 1927, contributions have been paid into the Sinking Fund under the provisions of the Financial Agreement 1927 as amended. The following contributions are to be paid into the Fund during each year—

- For a period of 38 years commencing with 1st January, 1928, at the rate of 5s. per cent. per annum on the 58-year period for New South Wales which commences on 1st July, 1928.
- For a period of 23 years commencing with 1st July, 1926, for redemption or conversion purposes, or to provide for funding a deficit for a State—
- (a) 5s. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue in respect of the loans raised for each State.
- (b) 2s. 6d. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue.
- (c) 5s. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue.
- (d) 5s. per cent. by the Commonwealth from revenue, in respect of the loans raised for each State.

In each year it is agreed that 2 loans raised after 30th June, 1927, expended on waiving assets, should be redeemed in a shorter period than 53 years, the annual contribution payable by the State shall be increased to the rate of 7s. 6d. per cent. per annum.

- In respect of loans raised on the security of Commonwealth Treasury Bills to meet a revenue deficit of 30m. in any year the rate of contribution shall be 5s. per cent. per annum compounded.
- In respect of any loan raised on behalf of a State to meet a revenue deficit accruing after 30th June, 1927, the rate of contribution shall be 5s. per cent. per annum for the period commencing on the 1st July next succeeding the date on which the loan is raised until 30th June, 1944; thereafter 4s. per cent. per annum for the period commencing on the 1st July next succeeding the date on which the loan is raised until 30th June, 1944; thereafter 3s. per cent. per annum by the State concerned.
- From revenue for a period sufficient to provide for the redemption of that loan, the contribution being deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum by the State concerned.
- 4½ per cent. by each State from revenue, provided that the redemption of that loan, the contribution being deemed to accumulate at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum compounded.

In addition, by each State on any loan raised on or after 1st July, 1926, were paid into the Fund by the Commonwealth from revenue under the Federal Aid Roads Act No. 46 of 1925, 22 of 1931 and 63 of 1932 and at the rate of 2s. 10d. per cent. per annum for 15 years from 1st January, 1929, 2s. 10d. per cent. per annum for 15 years from 1st July, 1945, under the Federal Aid Roads and Works Act No. 3 of 1937.

STATEMENT OF TRANSACTIONS.

1. INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND.

Subscriptions.

Australia joined the Fund in 1947, and was allotted a quota of United States \$200,000,000. Australia's subscription was equal to its quota and was paid partly in gold and partly in Australian currency as follows:—

The subscription in Australian currency was met by payment of £8,957,252 in cash and the lodgment of non-negotiable non-interest bearing securities to the value of £76,575,000.

In 1958-59 all members of the Fund were invited to increase their quotas by 50 per cent. and Australia consented to an increase of United States \$100,000,000 in its quota in June, 1959. Australia consented to a further special increase of United States \$100,000,000 in its quota in May, 1960. The increases in Australia's subscriptions were equal to the increases in its quotas and were paid as follows:—

The increased subscriptions in Australian currency were met by lodgment of non-negotiable non-interest bearing securities to the value of £66,964,226.

Transactions.

Australia purchased United States \$20,000,000 from the Fund with Australian currency in 1949 and United States \$30,000,000 in 1952. Australia repaid these drawings by repurchasing Australian currency from the Fund in 1953-54 and 1954-55.

On 30th April, 1959, Australia incurred an obligation under Article V, Section 7 (b) of the Fund Agreement to repurchase, with gold and convertible currencies, an amount of its original subscription in Australian currency to the Fund equivalent to United States \$14,081,000. This obligation was discharged on 17th June, 1959, by the payment from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of £6,323,910.

On 28th April, 1961, Australia purchased foreign currencies equivalent to United States \$175,000,000 from the Fund with Australian currency. As in the case of the previous transactions, the Reserve Bank arranged the purchase and the receipt of the foreign currencies and payment of Australian currency were not reflected in Government accounts. At the same time Australia arranged a stand-by credit equivalent to United States \$100,000,000 with the Fund for a period of one year from 1st May, 1961. No purchases of foreign currencies with Australian currency have taken place under this stand-by credit.

2. INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT.

Subscriptions.

Australia joined the Bank in 1947 and was allotted a capital subscription of United States \$200,000,000. Only 20 per cent. of members' subscriptions were called up, the remaining 80 per cent. being subject to call when required to meet obligations by the Bank arising out of its borrowing activities. Australia paid its 20 per cent. subscription as follows:—

In 1958-59, all members of the Bank were invited to increase their uncalled capital subscriptions by an amount equal to 100 per cent. of their original subscriptions. The purpose was to increase the Bank's potential to borrow money against which its uncalled capital acts as a guarantee. Australia consented to an increase in its uncalled capital subscription to the Bank of United States \$200,000,000. In June, 1959, Australia consented to a further special increase in its subscription to the Bank amounting to United States \$133,000,000. Only 10 per cent. of this increase was called up, the remaining 90 per cent. being subject to call when required to meet obligations of the Bank arising out of its borrowing activities. Australia paid its 10 per cent. subscription as follows:—

In respect of Australia's original subscription in Australian currency equivalent to United States \$36,000,000, or £16,071,418, payments amounting to £160,868 have been made from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to meet the Bank's administrative expenses in Australian currency. Australia made arrangements for the release of the balance of £15,910,550 by instalments for use in the Bank's lending operation in its member countries.
