7 Departmental items—basic appropriation

(1) For a departmental item for an entity, the Finance Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts that do not exceed, in total, the amount specified in the item.

Note: Generally, the Finance Minister is permitted, but not obliged, to issue the amounts out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. However, subsections (3) and (4) impose an obligation on the Finance Minister to issue the amounts in certain circumstances.

(2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for a departmental item for an entity may only be applied for the departmental expenditure of the entity.

The acquisition of new departmental assets will usually be funded from an other departmental item (in another Appropriation Act).

(3) If:

Note:

- (a) an Act provides that an entity must be paid amounts that are appropriated by the Parliament for the purposes of the entity; and
- (b) Schedule 1 contains a departmental item for that entity; then the Finance Minister, under subsection (1), must issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the full amount specified in the item.
- (4) If a departmental item for an Agency includes provision for payment of remuneration and allowances to the holder of:

1 2	(a) a public office (within the meaning of the <i>Remuneration Tribunal Act 1973</i>); or
3	(b) an office specified in a Schedule to the <i>Remuneration and Allowances Act 1990</i> ;
5	then the Finance Minister, under subsection (1), must issue out of

9	8 Administered items—basic appropriation
10	(1) For an administered item for an outcome of an entity, the Finance
11	Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts
12	that do not exceed, in total, the lesser of:
13	(a) the amount specified in the item; and
14	(b) the amount determined by the Finance Minister in relation to
15	the item, having regard to the expenses incurred by the entity
16	in the current year in relation to the item.
17	(2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for an
18	administered item for an outcome of an entity may only be applied
19	for expenditure for the purpose of carrying out activities for the
20	purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.
21	Note: The acquisition of new administered assets will usually be funded
22	from an administered assets and liabilities item (in another
23	Appropriation Act).
24	(3) A determination made under paragraph (1)(b) is not a legislative
25	instrument.

27	(1) The Finance Minister may, upon written request by a Minister,

10 Net appropriations

Departmental items

- (1) If a section 31 agreement applies to a departmental item, then the amount specified in the item is taken to be increased in accordance with the agreement, and on the conditions set out in the agreement. The increase cannot be more than the relevant receipts covered by the agreement.
- (2) For the purposes of section 31 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, each departmental item is taken to be marked "net appropriation".

Administered items

- (3) If a section 31 agreement applies to an administered item, then the amount specified in the item is taken to be increased in accordance with the agreement, and on the conditions set out in the agreement. The increase cannot be more than the relevant receipts covered by the agreement.
- (4) For the purposes of section 31 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, the following administered items are taken to be marked "net appropriation":
 - (a) the administered items for outcomes 1 and 2 of AusAID;
 - (b) the administered items for outcomes 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Department of Families, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs;
 - (c) the administered item for outcome 3 of the Department of Finance and Administration;
 - (d) the administered item for outcome 2 of the Department of Transport and Regional Services.

15 Appropriation of the Consolidated Revenue Fund

The Consolidated Revenue Fund is appropriated as necessary for the purposes of this Act.
